Change can create 21st century models of TVET institutions, more responsive and adaptable than the legacy structures from the last century.

About the Conference

In our conference in Houston, we will explore a number of ways that challenges can be viewed as opportunities. We will continue to focus, as we have for the last several years, on changing models of student success: predictive analytics, pathways, intrusive advising, etc. We'll be reporting on the outcomes from the international best practices of competency based education, (CBE), as well as providing reports from fourth industrial revolution factors as our emerging trends (ET) work and women factors in TVET. We will also be looking at faculty issues and concerns such as shared governance, contingent faculty, new approaches to professional development, support for department chairs, etc. We'll be considering other campus-wide issues such as free speech, sexual harassment, collaboration with student affairs, and a variety of others.
